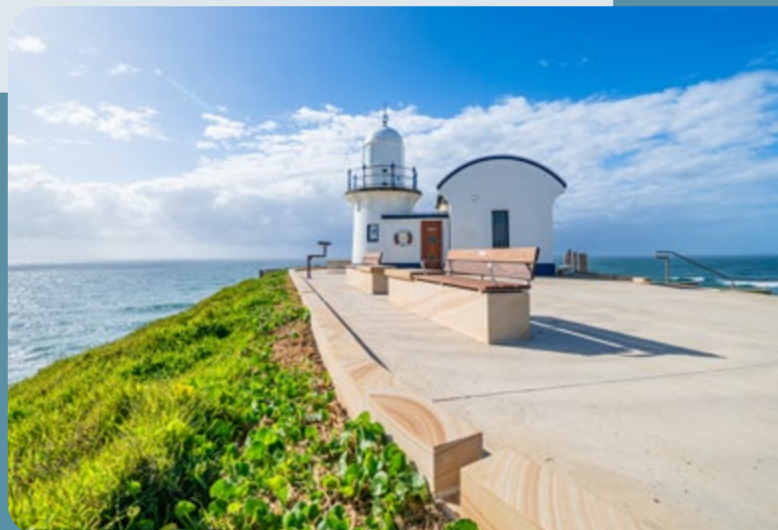

During the Summit, delegates will explore:

● Town Green & Town Beach Reserve

An evolving oceanfront precinct with family-friendly design, accessibility, activation, and community input.

● City Heart Renewal

A multi-stage transformation of Port Macquarie's urban centre driven by engagement, trials, and clear streetscape priorities. Located just minutes from the Summit venue and accommodation, the city centre reveals Port Macquarie's engagement-led approach with local art, tactical activations, and youth-led projects.

● Phillips Lane

A beloved laneway success story featuring art, lighting, micro-activation, and partnership with local businesses.

● Tacking Point Lighthouse

Sitting atop a rocky headland, this is one of Australia's most photographed coastal icons and now a place of cultural storytelling, environmental interpretation, and universal access. Enjoy stunning panoramic views - a sunrise essential.

● Beach-to-Beach Shared Pathway

A spectacular trail connecting beaches, headlands, and cultural landscapes, offering a world-class experience in accessible coastal design and showcasing coastal placemaking at its best. More than 8 kilometres of the 11.2 kilometres pathway is complete providing a safe, accessible, and scenic route for walkers, runners and cyclists.



Join a national leader in engagement-led placemaking

Port Macquarie-Hastings Council (PMHC) has earned a reputation for its community-first, and highly practical approach to placemaking. Engagement is embedded not as a step in the process, but as a mindset. Across the region, PMHC and its partners champion:

- Village and town centre communities

From the City Heart renewal to Town Beach Reserve, co-design has become an essential pathway to outcomes that feel genuinely owned.

2. People-Centred Activation Creating a Shared Sense of Place

Small experiments, and real-time testing have helped PMHC:

- Fast-track community feedback
- Build confidence and momentum
- Mobilise locals, business, creative

Phillips Lane and the emerging coastal nodes are standout examples of this method.

3. Engagement that Builds Identity & Belonging

Port Macquarie's engagement efforts draw out local stories, creativity, culture, and intergenerational knowledge. Whether revitalising laneways, activating parks, supporting youth arts, or shaping coastal experiences, the focus is on celebrating what makes each place distinct.

4. Partnerships that Expand Possibility

PMHC collaborates widely with community organisations, local businesses, tourism operators, cultural groups, and regional neighbours, to activate places that are welcoming and resilient. These partnerships extend the impact of traditional engagement and support long-term stewardship.

Throughout the Summit, sessions and field tours will explore:

- Engagement techniques for complex or contested spaces
- Tools to increase community participation
- How to build trust and safe environments for collaboration
- First Nations partnership models
- Digital and creative engagement tools

- Engagement that strengthens local economies and night-time vitality



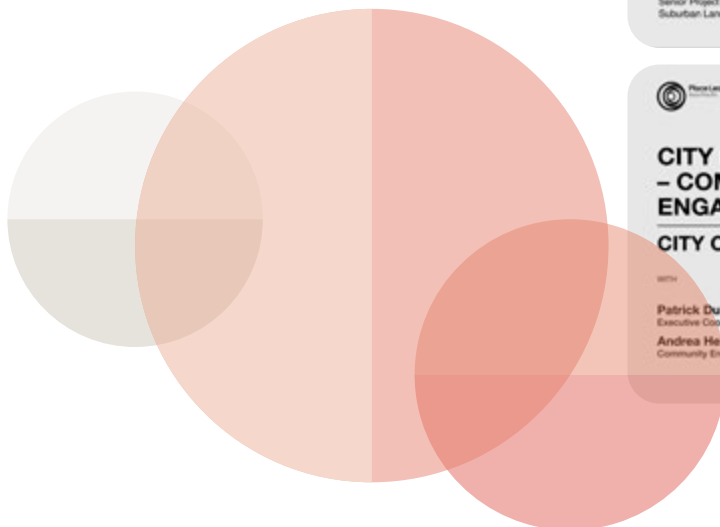

The 2026 program has been designed so delegates don’t just hear about engagement they **experience it** in live environments, led by the practitioners and communities who shaped them. You’ll step into precincts that illustrate how engagement influences design, operations, culture, identity, and resilience.

At its core, Place Engagement is about the relationships that make places work. It is the practice of listening deeply, empowering community voice, building trust, and creating the conditions for people to participate meaningfully in shaping their environment. When done well, engagement strengthens identity, improves design outcomes, and builds lasting stewardship.

The Place Leaders Place Engagement micro-credential, included with every Summit registration, provides the skills and methods to embed this practice across policy, planning, design, delivery, and operations. Its principles underpin this year’s Summit program.



Optional pre-summit tours & masterclasses

Tuesday 24 March 2026

- **Arrive at Airport - flights arrive from 8:40am.**
- We invite delegates to arrive early, immerse themselves in the region's places and stories, and begin connecting with peers in an informal, coastal setting.
- You're arriving in one of Australia's most loved coastal towns, a place where rainforest meets the river, and headlands meet the ocean. With 18 pristine beaches, a thriving creative scene, remarkable Birpai cultural landscapes, and a bustling city centre Port Macquarie offers a stunning backdrop for the Summit.
- If you're flying in, [Port Macquarie Airport](#) offers domestic links to Sydney and Brisbane with 40 flights weekly. Flights from Sydney (just over an hour gate to gate) arrive throughout the day, starting from around 8:40am. Direct flights from Brisbane are available as well. Port Macquarie Airport is only 7 minutes from the Summit venue and accommodation.
- Swim in warm, Mediterranean-like water with average **March temperatures of 25-26°C**. Port Macquarie's beaches are perfect for ocean dips, sunrise swims, and post-summit session 'resets'! Optional paid tours and masterclasses offer a deeper look at Port Macquarie–Hastings' most significant place-led initiatives before the Summit formally begins Wednesday evening.

Welcoming visitors is The Big Koala, a 2.5 metre sculpture painted by local artist Pauline Roods, part of the Hello Koalas Sculpture Trail. Koala Conservation Australia operates the world's first wild Koala breeding facility on site, where visitors can learn about the ongoing rejuvenation of the koala species following the impact of the 2019-2020 Mid-North Coast fires on surrounding habitats.

Learn how public art, climate-resilient materials, and universal design can turn a heritage landmark into a place that celebrates identity, supports tourism, and builds long-term stewardship.

- **Sea Acres Rainforest Centre** - Delegates step onto the elevated rainforest boardwalk for an immersive transition from city into Country. Discover how genuine collaboration with Birpai custodians guided design decisions that protect fragile ecology while building cultural connection. See how co-designed interpretation and careful threshold design enable thousands of visitors to experience a sensitive place without damaging it.

Return to Glasshouse for the Walking Tour, finishing 5:00pm.

Wave B - Town Centre, Laneways & Riverfront Activation Tour

Stops include:

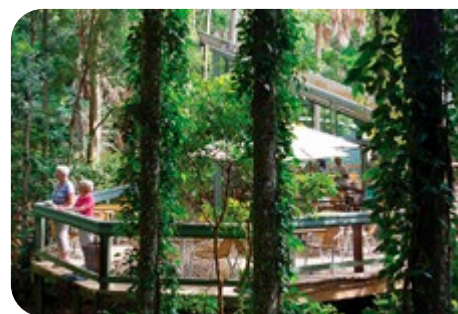
- **Phillips Lane** - Explore how a former service lane was reimaged through creative engagement into a vibrant cultural corridor. Delegates will see how murals and light-touch activation build community identity and draw people in.
